	CD with copy of recent x-rays or other imaging that has been done (ultrasound, CT, MRI).
	A list of your questions for the oncologist.
	A list of questions from other family members.
	Paper and pen or tablet to take notes, or a recording device if desired.
	Your expectations and goals for the consult.
	Your expectations and goals for the treatment plan overall.
